FROM THE DESK OF OUR SENIOR CHAPLAIN

Dear Brothers,

There is no sugar coating what is well known that our Church is experiencing the greatest crisis in centuries of its history. Episcopal representatives from around the world have been called to Rome to hopefully not only discuss it but to plan effectively a true course for the future. As Knights we have been In Solidarity with our Bishops. It is easy to say that when things are going well. But it is challenging when their weaknesses and ours are exposed to the light. But they are our bishops, the successors of the Apostles . We must pray for them. And yes, call them to task when appropriate in a respectful manner. We must care for the victims of immoral and criminal acts and must accompany them for they are the most wounded among having been betrayed not only by their perpetrators but also by those who knew of this evil and did nothing to eradicate it
At the same time the most vile actions are taking place in our state with the passage of the expanded abortion bill. Though celebrated by a Governor who was baptized Catholic and a legislature that uses the language that they are protective of the most vulnerable, no ones' rights are protected.

First of all, we must recognize that evil has no rights according to centuries of Catholic Moral Theology.

These are days in which we pray for divine intervention. Let each parish raise their voice in petition before the Blessed Sacrament. Let us support our Life giving agencies. Let us open crisis pregnancy centers wherever Planned Parenthood has established its mortuaries.

Hudson Valley Chapter Honors State Deputy Kenneth Latham

The Hudson Valley Chapter honored our NYS Deputy **Kenneth Latham** at the Chapter Meeting at St. Mary's Council #4065 on January 25, 2019. The meal and venue provided was excellent- Kudos to the Chef, Al Ronda, GK Steve Washburn, and the members of St. Mary's Council #4065

Dignitaries in attendance were **Joe Peluso**, Secretary to the State Deputy, **James A Foy** PSD, Former Vice Supreme Master, and our own **Walter J. (Wally) Wych**, State Secretary.

Chester F Smith, HV Conference Chairman, **David Kibler**, HV Chapter Chairman, and **Carl Schneider**, Chairman of the Board of District Deputies, presented gifts to the State Deputy.

The Cardinal Edward M Egan Council No. 16334 presented David Kibler, Chapter Chairman, with a special award in appreciation for his work and leadership in the creation of Council # 16334.

The State Deputy expressed his gratitude for the recognition from the Hudson Valley and how proud he was to be a Knight of Columbus. The State Deputy presented membership, Columbian, and Star Council awards to those councils who had earned the recognitions during the previous Fraternal Year.

He also encouraged every Knight to support the Culture of Life and commented sadly on the recent expansion of the NYS Abortion Laws and encouraged all Knights to support the NYS Legislators who voted against The "Reproductive Health Act" (RHA) numbered S.240 / A.21.

Knights of Columbus Under Attack

On Dec. 21, the Catholic News Agency reported that two Democratic senators -

California's Kamala Harris and Hawaii's Mazie Hirono — had asked Brian Buescher, a U.S. District Court nominee from Nebraska, whether his membership in the Knights of Columbus would prevent him from being an impartial judge.

Harris expressed concern that the Knights of Columbus — a Catholic fraternal organization founded in 1882 that she called "an all-male society comprised primarily of Catholic men" — had taken public positions on issues of reproductive rights and same-sex marriage that might compromise Buescher's judicial decision-making. Hirono wondered if Buescher would quit the organization if he was confirmed.

He assured the senators that, if confirmed, his decision-making would be shaped by the Code of Conduct for United States Judges and by his oath of office, not by any "policies or positions" taken by the Knights of Columbus.

A New Tool for Recruitment in the Digital Age

The technology in our pockets can help us keep the conversation going and recruit new members of the Order

Have you ever had a conversation with a man who would make a great addition to your council — but he hesitates to commit?

“I need to think about it,” he says. Or, “I could use some more information.”

That’s when you take out your smartphone and pull up your council’s custom **Prospecting Landing Page**. The future Knight can simply type in his name and email address to learn about upcoming council events he and his family may want to attend. He’ll get information about the Knights, even if he’s not ready to commit at that moment.

He enters his email address — and right away, he gets a message thanking him for his interest and giving him the council’s contact information. Meanwhile, your council’s grand knight or membership director receives an alert that this man is a prospect for the council to recruit.

Your council’s custom Prospecting Landing Page extends the conversation with potential members beyond a few minutes.

Now, you can keep them in the loop about council events and reasons to join. Meanwhile, these men will also receive weekly emails about the Knights from the marketing team at the Home Office.
