



Continuing faith programs and themes

To actively evangelize and promote our faith by developing working relationships with the bishops' offices, with the 8 priests who serve as their liaison, and with the dioceses and local parishes.

To accomplish this, we will engage the bishops and their representatives to work with us to achieve our common goals. We will invite them to join us and to minister with us through these programs.



Faith program highlights

- Shrine events and state religious programs

 (i.e. Marian icon prayer evenings, special masses for the Knights and Sister Columbiettes, etc.)
- Family events
 (picnics and outings around each conference)
- Seminary and seminarian sponsorship in dioceses
 (to support an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life, and to promote awareness of the Knights of Columbus)
- Statewide men's retreat (new)
 - A retreat for brother Knights and friends at a retreat house in New York state (Graymoor, and others TBA)
 - Invite seminarians and religious brothers to join us for this retreat
 - Ask participating seminarians to lead parts of the retreat weekend
 - Explore the possibility of funding a retreat scholarship for our seminarians
- Forge productive, strong and collaborative relationships with parishes, local communities and local charities
